	Solanum lycopersicum	Amish Paste	74 Days. Dates back to the early 1900's and is the best for sauces and canning. Its deep red fruits are large with a real tomato flavor. Not overly acidic. Indeterminate
	Solanum lycopersicum	Beefsteak	80 days. Large, flattened, solid, meaty, juicy, brilliantly red fruit, slightly ribbed. Up to 2 lbs. each. An excellent slicer with rich, sub acid flavor. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Black Krim	69 Days. Fruits, 8 to 12 oz., are a dark deep red with heavy green shoulders. Interior is a deep, reddish-green color. Sweet and tasty. Matures extremely early. Intermediate resistance to Late Blight. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Blush	75 Days. The elongated (2.5") cherry to saladette-sized fruits boast yellow skin with red marbling that gets more pronounced as the season goes on. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Celebrity	70 Days. Boasting all the great traits of the old favorite. Drought and disease resistance, great flavor, and huge yields. Celebration will become a new favorite in your garden. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Ceylon	65 days. Unique 2"/5cm multi-ribbed, mini-beefsteak shaped tomato. Large yields of 3" beefsteak tomato. Indeterminate.

	Solanum lycopersicum	Cherokee Purple	80 Days. Cherokee Indian heirloom, pre 1890 variety. Beautiful, deep, dusky purple-pink color, sweet flavor, large-sized fruit. Try this one for real old-time tomato flavor Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Chocolate Cherry	70 Days - Extremely flavorful, uniform, 1" round fruits in trusses of 8. Fruits hold stems very well, don't crack. Can pick before mature and ripen off the vine. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Clementine	68 Days. Recently introduced F1 hybrid. 2 oz tangerine colored fruit, sweet-tart flavor. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Dwarf Moby's Cherry	63 Days. A tasty little salad or snacking tomato., its well-balanced, delicious flavor, combined with its texture, makes it a perfect choice for grilling, salads, and salsa. 1-2 oz yellow to orange salad tomato. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Dwarf Stony Brook Heart	65 Days. The rugose, potato leaf plants of 'Dwarf Stony Brook Heart' are quite compact, reaching thirty-six to forty-eight inches tall, and are very productive. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Dwarf Uralskiy Ranniy	50 Days. Very early dwarf plant that is well suited for container growing. 2-4 oz beefsteak shaped fruit. Determinate.

	Solanum lycopersicum	Early Girl	52 Days. The one you can count on year after year. There's no faster-growing, better-tasting tomato! Huge crops of 4 to 6 oz. fruits. Ideal for canning. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Flaming Burst	70 Days. Small orange pear cherry tomato. Taste and texture better than Yellow Pear. The fruits are 1¼ x 1" golden orange and look like a cross between a pear tomato and a cherry tomato cluster. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Galina	70 Days. Galina tomatoes are very early and prolific. They produce large clusters of ¾-1" yellow cherry tomatoes. The tomatoes are resistant to cracking. Very sweet, tasty, well-balanced but complex flavor. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Gardener's Sweetheart	70 Days. Fire-engine red, mini-apple shaped cherry tomato. Firm texture and sweet flavor. Resistant to cracking. Up to 20 to 25 per truss. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Gold Nugget	55 Days. Vigorous plants bear numerous golden-yellow, fine-flavored, 1" oval "nuggets". Uniform, compact plants, averaging 24" in height, begin fruiting extra-early. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Green Zebra	78 Days. This is the most unusual variety you'll ever grow! Fully ripened fruits are bright green, with stripes of a still lighter green. Round, smallish, 2 to 4 oz. fruits have excellent, "real tomato" flavor. Indeterminate.

	Solanum lycopersicum	Legend	80 Days. 2-3 oz fruit in clusters of 7 or 8. Red with good tart tomato flavor. Early maturing and resistant to late blight. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Lemon Boy	72 Days. Highly adaptable. Large, deep oblate, lemon yellow fruit, averaging 6-7 oz. and about 3-1/2" across. Mild flavored and adds inviting color to salads. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Livingstone Paragon	75 Days. Developed and introduced in 1870, beginning the commercial tomato industry in the US. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Mortgage Lifter	80 days. Long-time favorite with good yields of very large, 1 to 2 lb., smooth, pink-skinned fruits. Very meaty fruits with few seeds. Very mild, delectable, sweet flavor. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Moskvich	60 Days. Fruits early and cold tolerant. Deep red color and rich flavor. Smooth and globe-shaped. 4-6 oz. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Oregon Spring	60 Days. 6-7 oz. fruit. First-early harvest for cool northern or high-elevation locations. Compact plant. High resistance to verticillium wilt. Determinate.

	Solanum lycopersicum	Quadro	70 Days. Medium sized, multi-use Roma style. Blocky, almost cube shaped. Late blight resistant. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Roma	75 Days. Most well-known paste-type tomato, perfect for sauces, pastes and ketchup. Heavy crops, bright red, pear-shaped fruits, nice and meaty, with very few seeds. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Salsa	70 Days. Early maturing 6 oz fruit. Flesh to juice ratio makes it a good choice for salsa. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	San Marzano	90 Days. Named after the region of Italy. Paste-type fruit with beautiful, smooth-skinned, bright red color, about 5 oz. Elongated shape, meaty and tasty. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Santiam	75 Days. Better than most at setting fruit under cooler temperatures. First fruits are early maturing. Large, red, up to 3" diameter and mostly seedless. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Santiam Sunrise	70 Days. Orange substitute for Sungold Sweet, but less fruity and tends to split less. Indeterminate.

	Solanum lycopersicum	Stupice	52 Days - Cold tolerant, superior flavor fruits are sugary sweet, weighing 1 to 2 oz. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Sungold	60-70 Days. Great "tomatoey" flavor and very sweet - an 8 on the brix scale. 1" round globes that are very attractive golden orange when ripe. Productive vines provide very high yields. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Super Sauce	70 Days. Large nearly seedless canning tomato. SuperSauce also makes a superlative salad tomato; its perfect for a meaty and tasty hamburger slice too. A roma with aroma. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Super Sweet 100	65 Days. Produces long strands of 100 or more. Super sweet 1 oz and 1" diameter fruit. Extra-high in Vitamin C. Produces throughout the season. Requires staking. Indeterminate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Sweet Tangerine	68 Days. A Burpee exclusive. Large delectable tomatoes ripen early. Clean, bushy plants, quite disease resistant and set very heavy crops. Determinate.
	Solanum lycopersicum	Taxi	65-70 Days. For short season areas. Bright yellow 4-6 oz. fruits, smooth and blemish free, meaty, mild and acid free. For salads, sandwiches or salsas. Heavy yielder. Determinate.
